

About the Course: This course is built on state property. No breaking branches, leaving trash, or degrading the property in any such way. This is a tone course made with 5 gallon buckets as your basket. The tones are not permanent so take it easy on them. They are merely spiked into the ground. Tee boxes are two cedar shims painted orange. They will tell you the hole number, direction the hole is intended, distance to the basket, (as the disc is intended to fly), and par. Only number 6 is a par 4 all others par 3. On the top of the buckets is a spray painted arrow to the next tee box. Mandos have green arrows. Use this in conjunction with the map and you should have no trouble.

From parking walk up the hill, parallel to Wylie School Rd to find tee box #1

1. Straight ahead fading slightly left at the end.
 2. Bends to the right, you can just see the bucket if you stand to the right of the tee box.
 3. Wooded hole more or less straight on. Possible backhand and forehand routes to the bucket.
 4. Straight ahead you can see a metal gate against the road. Bucket just before.
 5. Fairway plays straight with a fade right at the tail end.
 6. Is a double t box with 6 going one way and 16 the other. It's a long hole with a piece of orange tape hanging from a tree 150yds out to let you know where you should be throwing. Parallel to the road for the duration of the hole.
 7. Is a double t box. There are two marked trees just in front of the t box which are mando to go between. Orange tape ahead hanging in a tree to direct you to the unseen bucket. Bucket not far on the other side of the stone wall. There is a little stream that is just beyond the bucket which is OB.
 8. You can see the bucket to your left. Big hyzer shot with a marked mando tree you must play to the right of. Go to the left and you still must come back around the tree. Stone wall borders this fairway and going over is OB.
 9. Is straight ahead up over the hill.
 10. Straight ahead back down the hill. T box is joint with 7. Ribbon hanging from a tree far ahead for directional purpose. Essentially play down the hill back up little hill and bucket is at the back side of that hill. Big drop down if you play past the bucket.
 11. T box plays over the water. First throw should be straight ahead and would benefit if it fades right at the end. Bucket under a group of large pines.
 12. Fairway plays straight up the hill. You can see the bucket at the top of the rock mound.
 13. Fairway plays down then back up a hill where you will see a big mando tree that must be played to the left of.
 14. Long winded wooded hole. Tape hanging in a tree right where the fairway turns left to the bucket up the hill.
 15. Open hole. Fairway plays straight with fade to the right at the end though backhand route is possible just not as open.
 16. Straight ahead is a short cedar tree. The bucket is 5ft to the right side.
 17. Straight wooded tunnel shot, downhill, maybe not as difficult as it looks.
 18. From the top of the rock mound you can see the bucket. One of the longer holes.
