

## UC SANTA CRUZ DISC GOLF COURSE

*Welcome to the UCSC Disc Golf Course. Disc golf has been played here at UCSC as long or longer than anywhere in the world. The first Disc Golf Tournament was in 1974. At this point in time the course is in a state of disarray due to construction and theft. Please bear with us as it is a work in progress. If you prefer a more formal disc golf experience, please visit the greatest Disc Golf Course in the World at Upper DeLaveaga Park (go past the ball golf course). **Please observe the following rules: NO DOGS, NO ALCOHO. Always yield to pedestrians and runners. There should never be a reason why someone should be struck by a disc.** All it takes is one incident to permanently close the course. All pars are 3 with golf discs and par 4 with lids.*

*NOTES ON PLAY: All asphalt is considered Out of Bounds (OB). The course is set up so you can play it forwards (out) and backwards (in). Most of the pins are posts (either metal or wooden). Any part of the post is considered good. Enjoy the view and Happy Golfing.*

- 1) Tee from across the road (Hagar) at the walk way directly west of the Northwest part of the OPERS Parking lot The pin is the white post on the hillside to the Northeast.
- 2) Tee from a flat area south of the first pin. The second pin is a light pole at the far side of the field above the main OPERS Building. Anything over the fence is OB. Take extra caution here as there is a lot of foot traffic here.
- 3) Tee from a flat area north of the last pin. The third pin is the post on the hillside directly east.
- 4) The next Tee is from the pavement in front of the bench on Stevenson Hill. The pin is a post with a tilted metal top on it on line with the lefthand turn in the track.
- 5) The next tee is from the white line at the 600 meter mark on the track. The pin is a basket in the notch directly east.
- 6) Tee from the track next to the post by the soccer field. The pin is a post behind the large stand of bushes to the south. Be careful not to throw it into the bushes. They are disc eating beings.
- 7) Tee from the post by the soccer field. The pin is the post on the hillside to the south.
- 8) The next hole is a long one. Tee from the track directly south of the last pin. The pin is the post with the tilted top directly west.
- 9) The next tee is from the pavement by the rock and light pole west of the last pin. The pin for this hole is to the right of the large oak adjacent to the access road. Remember, asphalt is OB.
- 10) The next tee is between the fence and a asphalt curb northwest of the last pin. The tee position parallels the road (Hagar). The pin is a lightpole down the dirt

pathway between the large Oak Trees. Be careful. If there are drummers, do not play the hole or use a different tee area. It is also a high use area. Use a spotter to ensure safety.

- 11) Tee from the old pavement in front of the bench to the south (past the drum circle). The pin is the same tilted post as #8.
- 12) Tee from the 200 meter mark on the track. The pin is the #7 post.
- 13) Tee from the same pin position as the #8 hole. Pin is the #6 post.
- 14) Tee from the 600 meter mark on the track and throw to the basket in the slot
- 15) To get to the next tee, go down the path towards the road (Coolidge). Turn right and cross the drainage ditch. The pin is the tilted post used as hole #4.
- 16) Tee from the same spot as #4. Throw to the pin used for hole number 3.
- 17) Use a flat worn area adjacent to the last pin. Throw to the hole used for number 2.
- 18) Tee from a worn area northwest of the last pin. The pin for this hole is the same used for number one. Any disc thrown over the fence or onto the asphalt at the basketball courts is OB.
